

Viljandi



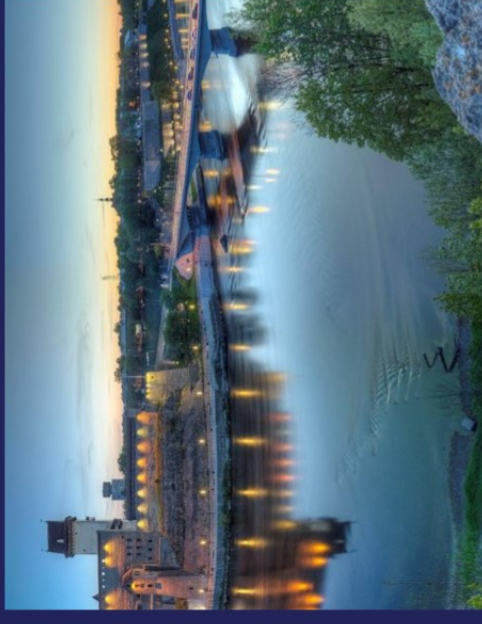

It is a popular summer holiday resort with many hotels, restaurants and large beaches.



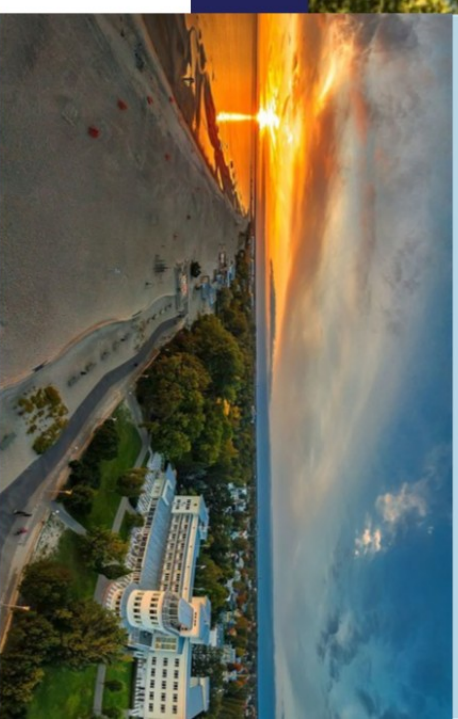
Tallinn
